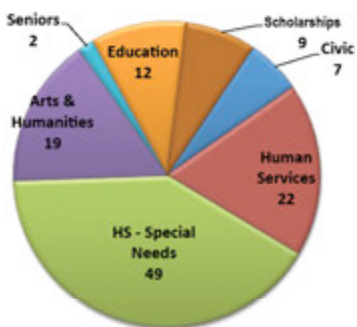

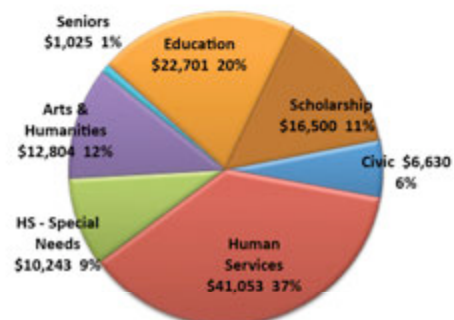

2010 Total Number of Grants = 120



2010 Grant Value = \$110,957*



Giving to the community is the gift that keeps giving. These charts show the funds granted to help people in Broomfield during the last year. Competitive grants are those given annually during the three cycles for which non-profits can submit applications. In 2010 the Broomfield Community Foundation awarded 120 grants in the amount of \$110,957. Additionally, the Foundation made an interfund grant to the Legacy Fund in the amount of \$34,962.

The Foundation's Legacy Fund is an endowed fund which will provide a permanent source of income to substantially increase our gifts to community organizations. The minimum goal for this fund is to reach \$1,000,000 which will be the endowed principal. Once reached, the Foundation will be able to use the earnings to give money to benefit Broomfield citizens. It would be wonderful to reach this minimum goal in 2011. The current Legacy fund balance is \$836,581.

It is the Board's desire to target increased grant money to the areas where it is needed the most. In order to help with decision making, the Foundation has undertaken an indicator/needs assessment project. We thank Martin Dormish, a community volunteer, for his help with the research piece of this project. It is our hope to have a report that can be used by the entire community before year's end. ♥
